



Ambassador Tamaki Tsukada is the Deputy Chief of Mission at the Embassy of Japan in Washington, a post he assumed in September 2020. He is also the current Permanent Observer in the Organization of American States (OAS).

Prior to his present position, he was Director General for Global Issues at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs after serving as Deputy DG for Economic Affairs and Latin American & Caribbean Affairs (2019). He

briefly served as Deputy Assistant Minister for Parliamentary Affairs in 2018.

During this period, he was Sous Sherpa for G20 and G7, Chief Negotiator for Climate Change, and board member of several key international organizations such as the Green Climate Fund (GCF), the Global Fund to fight AIDS, TB and Malaria and the Global Alliance for Vaccination and Immunization (Gavi).

Joined the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs in 1987. Worked in the areas of Trade (TPP and bilateral FTAs), Development Cooperation (loan aid; policy planning; budget) and Energy & Food Security, among others. He was seconded to the Cabinet Secretariat in 2006-2008 as senior coordinator for overseas Development Cooperation and Global Health.

Foreign postings include London (Economic & Energy) 1990-1992; Moscow (Political & Foreign Policy) 1999-2001; Geneva (UN Humanitarian & Human Rights) 2001-2004; New Delhi (Economic & Development Cooperation) 2011-2014; and most recently Washington D.C. (Culture, Media and Strategic Communication) 2014-2017.

Graduated from Tokyo University (BA Law, 1987) and Oxford University (Merton College, BA/MA Modern History, 1990).

Born on November 23, 1964; he is an amateur flautist and a lover of chess, contract bridge and math problem solving.
